According to his family, several officers raided Elwaleed Imam Hassan Taha's home, searched the house and took him to an unknown place. Elwaleed suffer from a high blood pressure.

Sudan Human Rights Network is deeply concerned about the wellbeing of Elwaleed Imam Hassan Taha, and respectfully appeal to Your Majesty to urge Saudi authorities to:

- Immediately and unconditionally release Elwaleed Imam Hassan Taha, since no valid legal charges have been made
- Requesting assurances that he is being humanly treated, that he has immediate and regular access to his family, lawyers, and any necessary medical attention.
